From the Director's Desk

National Reading Month is celebrated in March to honor Dr. Seuss's birthday. In this month people, especially children, read a lot more in celebration and although some people may find the increased emphasis on reading to be boring, the increase in reading during this month has significant benefits that will continue to pay off in the future. Reading is one of the best habits to develop; it strengthens the mental muscles, helps to improve comprehension and analytical abilities, and increases imagination and boosts memory. But what about the little ones who cannot read yet? With a little help, they can enjoy National Reading Month too.

Research findings outlined in a recent report of the National Early Literacy Panel highlight the fact that literacy skills begin to develop at birth. The panel identified a number of early skills that are related to—and may even help predict—a child's later success with reading and writing.

Skills closely related to later success with reading and writing

- Alphabet knowledge—the ability to name letters and the sounds they make
- Phonological awareness—the ability to hear and manipulate the sounds of spoken language (such as hear the beginning sound of a word)
- Rapid letter or number naming—the ability to quickly name letters or numbers
- Rapid object or color naming—the ability to quickly name random series of colors or objects
- Phonological memory—the ability to remember spoken information for a short period of time
- Writing letters or one's own name—the ability to write single letters in isolation, or write their own name

Outside the service area, if you don't have a PA library card, the cost is \$10 per year.




Punxsutawney Memorial Library Emergency Weather Policy

Pertaining to poor weather conditions, the Punxsutawney Area School District's actions will guide the actions of the Punxsutawney Memorial Library. If the school deems it unsafe for students and staff to travel, we will take this into consideration for our patrons and staff as well.

- 1) If the schools are delayed due to poor weather, we will match its delay to open our doors. Example: If the school is on a two-hour delay, we will open two hours later. If we normally open at 10 a.m., we will open at noon.
- 2) If the schools are closed for the day, the library will delay opening. An evaluation will occur by 11:30 a.m. on whether to open at noon or remain closed.
- 3) If potentially hazardous weather occurs, or is likely to occur, after the start of a school session, the director will assess the situation and make the decision to remain open or close the doors. If the director is not present at the library, a staff member should attempt to contact him/her. If contact cannot be made and the staff on duty agree that conditions are unsafe (or could potentially become unsafe within a reasonable amount of time), they will close the library and post a sign on the doors to notify to patrons.




BASIC LITERACY








Join us Saturday March 16 @ 3:00 p.m. for an all-ages appropriate story time.

As always, there is no cost to join us; but parents/guardians must remain in the library with their children under the age of 10.






