3/23/20	Monday
Writing * Writing prompt pages are all available to print.	What I like most about myself is _____. Encourage your child to draw a picture and complete the writing prompt. You can write for them and have them trace your words if they are able to write on their own. Enjoy a conversation about why rules are important and keep us safe.
Art	Collect nature items or anything extra you can tear up around your house. Write your child's name, put glue over their name and then have them put the items they have collected on the glue. If you do not have glue you can use tape.
Movement	Print our Counting movements sheet. If you can not print, write them out and cut apart. Let your child pick one out of a hat, sock, bag, etc. and follow the number and movement. This is also great for number identification.
Extra	During meal time or a special time you are all together during the day, have each person give a compliment to everyone in the room.

3/24/20	Tuesday
Writing	My favorite food is _____
Language	“Would you Rather Eat” Print our sheet or use it to engage in conversation and lots of laughs.
Math	Subtraction with natural items or items around the house. * video will be posted
Extra	Help your child prepare their favorite food. Post a picture of them enjoying it.
3/25/20	Wednesday
Writing	The birds sound like _____. If you can, go outside or open a window and listen to the birds. You can also search online for bird sounds. If you can, take your paper outside and draw a picture of a bird while enjoying their sound.
Fine Motor	“Feed the birds”. Print our bird sheet and find items around your home to use as worms (cut up pipe cleaners, rubber bands, strips of paper, etc.) if you have tongs or tweezers have your child use those to pick up the “worms” and feed the “birds”. For older infants/ young toddlers, use items that are not a choking hazard and have them use their fingers to pinch the item and “feed the birds”.
Science	Go outside or watch out a window. Count how many birds you see. You can make a graph and chart different types of birds too. If you are able to go outside, look for a bird feather.
Extra	Dig for worms. Watch them move. Have your child lay down and move like a worm. 

Thursday	3/26/20
Writing	I feel happy sheet
Social/Emotional	Look in a mirror and make a happy face. Talk about how you feel when you are happy and what makes you happy.
Art	Use two toilet paper rolls and tape, glue, or staple together. Have your child paint, color, decorate them and use them as binoculars to look for birds. *sample picture will be posted.
Extra	Take a picture of your child and/or family with your smiles 😊. 
Friday	3/27/20
Writing	When I grow up sheet
Language	Talk to your child about what they want to be when they grow up, if you have access to a computer, look up what tools they use, what they wear, what they do while at work and why their job is important. You can also look at a video to see them doing their job.
Math	Print or make your own “Cover the number sheet”. Cut up paper or use rocks to cover the number. Roll a dice or write numbers on paper. When you pick a number have your child cover the number on the sheet.
Extra	Hat Day. Post a picture of you in your favorite hat.
